



Cognex Statement on EU Cyber Resilience Act (CRA) Compliance

Cognex acknowledges and fully supports the European Union's commitment to strengthening the cyber resilience of hardware and software products with digital elements available in the EU market, as set forth by the EU Cyber Resilience Act (CRA).

The CRA entered into force on December 10, 2024. Its main cybersecurity requirements will become applicable on December 11, 2027, while obligations to report actively exploited vulnerabilities and severe incidents will begin on September 11, 2026.

To ensure timely and robust compliance, Cognex is reviewing the cybersecurity requirements outlined in EU CRA 2024/2847. We are proactively conducting regular risk assessments, updating our incident response protocols, and providing ongoing cybersecurity training for our staff. These actions are part of a comprehensive strategy to meet the CRA's obligations and to safeguard our customers and stakeholders.

Cognex remains committed to strengthening our cybersecurity posture across our information security management systems, products, and services, in alignment with internationally recognized standards and frameworks. Some of our achievements include:
